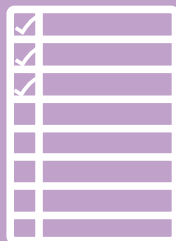

3 Inspect Properties

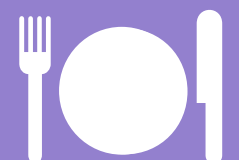


Inspect the property before signing up

Before you commit to any type of permanent accommodation, we strongly encourage you to inspect the property so you can judge for yourself the convenience, transportation and safety aspects of the house.

Basic things to look out for:

- Security, locks on windows and doors
- How many bedrooms are there altogether
- How many bathrooms are there?
- Internet? Is it wireless or cable?
- Dishwasher? If you hate washing up, and there are lots of people living there, a dishwasher is an essential item.
- Is there a washing machine or do you have to use a laundromat?



Ask yourself:

- Is this place for me?
- Can I afford the rent?
- Does it meet my essential requirements?
- Do I agree with the special terms and conditions?
- Do I agree with the house rules?
